


We are starting up grocery Sunday again! The Outreach Committee would like to bring your attention to the Karing Kitchen's need for these groceries: <u>sugar, can</u>




milk, corn starch, Worcestershire sauce, flakes of ham. White baskets will be at the main entrance for your donations. Thank you.
