PASTORAL LETTER

June 24, 2022

This morning I drove over to Royal Court for the chapel service there. I've lost count how many times I've visited that building. The woman at the desk made chit chat with me while I signed in and I commented on how busy things were. Just then, around the corner, Lois Weatherby appeared and walked over to where I was. "Would you like a cup for tea before we go to chapel?" she asked. "We have coffee, too!" I sat at a table with her friends while Lois poured me a cup of coffee, black. (I was operating on three cups of tea already so I figured it was time to switch!)

It's a nice feeling talking to people. The women at the table were filled with good humour and good stories. I loved the randomness of it all, as I had not expected to be sharing a cup of coffee with anyone today. They were so gracious and welcoming. I really felt their hospitality. As we all got up to go to chapel, I thanked Lois for the coffee. One woman said, "Thanks for letting this old Anglican join you!"

There was construction work happening in the hall outside of the chapel. We could hear the hymn singing as we approached. When I arrived, I introduced myself and commented on how leading services there was something I valued. We even sang, "In the Sweet By and By" which I haven't sung for years. During the service, I asked about moments where heaven and earth connect and one woman replied that for her it was the moment she held a baby. What I loved was the good humour in the room and how interactive everyone was and happy to be there.

After the service a man approached and asked if I knew two of his friends, which I was happy to say I knew them well! Another man made a point of saying thank you for the service. It was a highlight of my day for sure.

On my way down the elevator I was joined by a Sister who lives at Royal Court named Dora. We discovered that we had a mutual friend in common from Antigonish. She said, "I know all of the Sisters from there because I'm a Cape Bretoner!" By the time the elevator doors opened I think we were convinced that we were somehow related, even though she's from Cheticamp. I said, "I could tell you were a Sister, you just have that vibe." That made her laugh.

On my way home I dropped a book off to a friend, then arrived back to a waiting dog and a phone call. The other day, CBC had contacted me about a story they wanted to do on something I had posted about a member of our church, Pat Gillespie, giving my son Eli a fishing rod. He said, "We love this story. Can we talk to Pat?" I said, "He's a pretty humble guy so I'm not sure, you may have to ask a few times." They did, and finally Pat agreed to talk. As I spoke with host Kahlil Akhtar, from Shift, I was quite taken with how interested he was in Pat. I think he thought it was just about the nicest thing Pat could do to give his



fishing rod to a little boy. The story will air on CBC New Brunswick's program Shift later this afternoon and on the CBC News website.

This coming Sunday will be our last together for a little while. I will be on vacation for the month of July; however, I am still available if anything should happen. I'm not far away. When church resumes in August the service time will be 10am.

I'm happy to share with you that as a "Welcome Back!" to the congregation on September 11th we will be having an outdoor service at Rotary Lodge, Camp Centennial (weather permitting) with a barbecue. This will be a wonderful time to bring a lawn chair and have church with different music and a relaxed atmosphere in a place that has been special for us for many years. An announcement will appear in August asking people to sign up for this service. (We know some will be away but this was the only date available at Camp Centennial.)

This will be the last pastoral letter for the summer months. I am grateful for your feedback, and I have loved connecting with you through these letters. It's just a small way of saying that the church is here for you, and that you are part of it. It doesn't serve any other purpose. Being able to share with you the interesting moments, or the hard moments, from my week has been a blessing in disguise. I hope to see you all again soon.

We will be celebrating Communion this Sunday, June 26th (for those who will be joining us online).
